




Property Maintenance Operative

Apprenticeship

Overview

The primary role of a Property Maintenance Operative is to optimise property condition and quality and to ensure the building is kept in a safe working condition.

PMOs need to maintain a high level of quality, providing maximum satisfaction to customers, clients, guests and their teams

Key responsibilities in the role of Property Maintenance Operative include:

- Understanding the mechanism of buildings including electrical, plumbing, plant, safety systems and equipment
- Providing first and immediate response to fault finding whilst maximising quality and ensuring cost effectiveness
- · Ensuring prevention of major damage that could result in extensive costs and minimise reactive intervention

Assessments / Exams

To achieve the Apprenticeship standard all components must be completed, including Functional skills at the required level if you don't have exemptions. All Apprenticeship standards include an end point assessment which is required to complete the standard.

Entry requirements

To join this Apprenticeship programme, you will need English and Maths GCSEs at grade 3(D) or above. Alternatively, you need to be working at a minimum initial assessment baseline of level 1 in English & Maths.

What this apprenticeship leads to

Completing this Apprenticeship programme will allow development through a Level 3 Apprenticeship and enable progression into job roles across a wide range of sectors.

These include:

- Technical Specialist (Electrical or Plumbing)
- Supervisory and management positions (such as Facilities Management)
