

Overview

An operations/departmental manager manages teams and/or projects, and achieves operational or departmental goals and objectives, as part of the delivery of an organisational strategy.

Working in the private, public or third sector and in all sizes of an organisation, specific responsibilities and job titles will vary, but the knowledge, skills and behaviours required will be the same.

Key responsibilities may include creating, leading and managing teams, managing change, financial and resource management, talent management, coaching and mentoring.
