

Overview

This course will enable those who are speakers of other languages to develop the language and skills necessary to go on and train as community interpreters at Level 3 and higher levels.

You will be able to understand how to go about getting voluntary bilingual work and optional voluntary placements, enabling you to gain experience prior to undertaking higher level study in Community Interpreting.

You will look more closely at some of the aspects of language and other skills which you will need to be successful on community interpreting training schemes. You will develop personal skills such as assertiveness and listening skills, which will support your future study and work as a community interpreter.
